Individual and Family Activity Ideas (What Will You Do This Week?)

Temple/Family History Work

Note: We need more indexing and more names for the temple, with more people doing work there. But there are many other ways to help.

- Attend the temple.
- Log into your family tree at FamilySearch.org and post a photo or story of yourself or an ancestor.
- Study a place or time in which an ancestor lived. Write and share your thoughts and discoveries.
- Give someone a ride to the temple.
- Learn how to index. Set a goal.
- Have a family home evening lesson on the importance of temple covenants.
- Do online training at FamilySearch.
- Study the plan of salvation.
- Find a family history document about an ancestor and add it to your tree.
- Index another batch.
- Write part of your personal or family history start with a favorite memory.
- Babysit for temple-goers.
- Get acquainted with a living relative.
- Make sure your and your immediate family's information is complete and correct in your tree.

- Prepare family names for temple work.
- Tell your children a story about your parents/grandparents. (Write it down!)
- Ask for more good links.
- Study an historical event in which an ancestor was involved. Write, too!
- Volunteer to clean the temple.
- Pray for direction but don't wait.

Missionary Work

Note: This list excludes many activities which are simply part of being a good neighbor, which is a separate obligation with its own blessings.

- Invite a friend to your (or a family member's) baptism.
- Post a favorite Church video on social media (Facebook, Twitter, Google+).
- Practice answering likely questions about the Church and your life in it.
- Invite a friend to a baby blessing.
- Post a fun photo from a church activity.
- Invite a friend to a church activity or meeting, or to tour the chapel.
- Read a chapter of *Preach My Gospel*.
- Invite a friend to Family Home Evening. (It doesn't have to be religious!)
- Write to a full-time missionary
- Invite full-time or ward missionaries to teach your family a missionary lesson.

- If friends invite you to their church activities or services, go.
- Donate to the missionary fund.
- Invite friends to hear you speak/teach.
- Pray for service opportunities.
- Mention a favorite conf. talk to a friend.
- Invite a friend to missionary lessons.
- Post a photo of a favorite scripture on Twitter or Facebook, with comments.
- Consider directing your efforts to inactive friends, not just nonmembers.
- Reread your mission journal.
- Pray for direction but don't wait.
